Who are we?

This is the privacy notice of Scotts Project Trust (Scotts).

Our registered office is at Delarue Hall, Delarue Close, Shipbourne Road, Tonbridge, Kent, TN11 9NN.

Scotts is registered with the Care Quality Commission (CQC) to provide Residential Care without nursing at St Peter's Row and Personal Care services to adults living in their own home.

Scotts provides three services to Adults with Learning Disabilities- (1) Residential Care, at St Peter's Row. (2) A Supporting Independence Service (SIS) for people living at the Oaks and Willows (3) A Day Opportunities Service, at the Development Centre.

The Development Centre comprises of a Hall and a Barn. These buildings are available for private hire in the evenings and at the weekends.

The Trustee responsible for overseeing Data Protection is Sue Bourne.

The personal information we collect and use

We collect the contact details of Hall and Barn hirers. We rely on Consent as the lawful basis on which we collect and use this personal information.

The information is contained in files (manual and electronic) which are subject to strict security and authorised access policies.

Personal information that becomes inactive is also kept securely for as long as it is needed, before being safely disposed of.

How we collect information

Personal Information is collected directly from the Hall or Barn hirer.

All personal information obtained, will always be handled in accordance with our data protection and confidentiality policies.

Our databases are periodically reviewed to ensure they meet required privacy



standards and comply with our general data protection security and protection policies.

How we use your personal information

All personal information obtained is used for hiring purposes and to send information about our work, fundraising and invitations to events. We will never pass on or sell personal information to any third parties for marketing purposes.

How long your personal data will be kept

Scotts will hold the personal information of Hall and Barn hirers for 6 years after the date of the last hiring.

Rights

Under GDPR individuals have a number of rights which can be accessed free of charge. These rights allow individuals to:

- Know what we are doing with personal information and why we are doing it
- Ask to see what personal information we hold about them
- Object to us sending information about our work, fundraising and invitations to events
- Ask us to correct any mistakes in the information we hold
- Make a complaint to the Information Commissioners Office
- Ask us to delete information that we hold
- Object to how we are using the information

We will always seek to comply with requests.
